
OUR PROJECT OFFERS DISTRICTS A CONTINUUM OF SUPPORTS

Less intensive Moderately intensive More intensive

As needed technical assistance, online resources, evaluation tools, professional learning modules, etc.

Regularly scheduled technical assistance, district leadership team participation, task specific support (e.g., manual revision, SAM data analysis, resource mapping), etc.

Partnership with the PS/RtI Project to engage in teams-based problem solving and planning (i.e., needs analysis, goal setting, action planning, progress monitoring), onsite technical assistance and training, etc.



DISTRICT GOAL SETTING EXAMPLES

- By the end of the school year, the percent of students identified as "off track" will decrease by at least 2%, as measured by Early Warning Systems (EWS) indicators.
- By the end of the 2024-25 school year, the number of office discipline referrals issued for incidences of disrespect, disruption, and inappropriate behavior will decrease by at least 20%.
- By the end of the 2025-26 school year, the percent of students scoring Level 3 or above on the Algebra 1 EOC will increase to at least 50%.
