Amy Yeater - Martin County: i believe the conversations may be happening in Martin but that there are no final decisions at this point.

miami dade: conversations and planning is in process for multiple options, no decisions as yet

Jayna Jenkins: yes conversationa are occurring - contingency plans - waiting on more info from state (governor) phasing all of Florida back - and guidance from DOH

Katie Hamm: Absolutely the conversations are occuring and being in conjunction with state DOE and CDC guidelines

Dr. David Maddock - Osceola: The conversations are occuring for us, but there are too many variables. Transportation, scheduling, student safety. We have a Back to School Task Force reviewing all possibilities.

Amy Soto: Focus on scaffolding and vertical progression

Gulf--Martha Weimorts: Same in Gulf with increased monitoring of progress.

Beth Hardcastle: I'm back

Blair - Pasco County: 1. Focus on Essential Standards and acceleration to overcome the COVID slide phenomenon, adjust district blue prints

Emilye Tracy: Increased Mental Health supports

Dr. Thompson: We cant really say based on not knowing the uncertian format

Troy Radford: Volusia....unsure as well

Katie Hamm: Pinellas County - teachers are the first point of contact with students. On-going celebrations and recognition. Support staff are assisting with more intense needs and supports

Anna Morin: is there any concern about attendance of blended and FTE allcoations?

Dr. David Maddock - Osceola: We are examining how to provide assessments with distance learning in place. One of the primary issues with the current MTSS format was that we were not able to accurately determine how our students were responding to interventions provided.

Holly Schultz: We iwill be meeting at the school level to discuss what it will look like, but it will be after the DOE and CDC give some guideline. We will be looking at all three TIER levels.

Tammy: Working on plans for Restorative Practices training, trauma, and PBIS to ensure we come back with a mindset we need for our students

Gwen Vann: Lafayette's plan looks the same as in the past - serving all students as needed.

Lisa, Palm Beach: we are going to continue with expectation of support being provided but depending on how we come back (virtual/blended/face to face) we have different expectations for progress monitoring

Jodi Leung': No worries!! I'll bet we are all pretty good at this flexibility.

Blair - Pasco County: 2. Identify students at risk based on prior risk levels along with engagement risk based on data from distance learning

Carrie Rullo: Fully distance, all levels of support continue but still not comfortable with the validity of the progress monitoring if we are fully remote

Christine K Crispino: Monroe county is putting together a back to school task force to help us see what school will look like when we return, it will have school and community input

Jayna Jenkins: Love it Beth!! That sounds a lot like 'the dog ate my homework' but he really DID!

Carrie Rullo: If we happen to return in a blended model. all levels of support will continue and we are more comfortable with the progress monitoring piece

Blair - Pasco County: Tier 1 and 2 will focus on grade level standards vs overdoing deep remediation of prior grade standards

Ann Selland: I am continually getting knocked off

Dr. Hall- Levy: We will be examining our Progress Monitoring Data that will drive our instruction and of course continue to provide Tier 2 and 3 services to students.

Dr. David Maddock - Osceola: We surveyed all of our teachers with over one thousand responses and will share our results related to how distance learning went.

Holly Schultz: I see someone else mentioning assessments. Yes, that is a big thing in monitoring and determining the responses to interventions.

Blair - Pasco County: Better universal screening practices to understand where students enter. Focus on SEL and behavior needs to ensure smooth reentry.

Gadsden: Examining our progress monitoring data and ensuring that the SEL component is included at each Tier

Holly Schultz: There will definitely need to be mental health support in transitioning in the fall.

Ann Selland: I agree with you Holly

Dr. Thompson: yes

Christine K Crispino: yes

Dr. Hall- Levy: We will also revisit our Curriculum Maps to align with student data. Further discussion regarding how to meet the needs of students both behaviorally and mental and social needs

Christine K Crispino: Teachers, community members, etc

Lisa Flannery: Lee also has a task force- parents, teachers, admin, etc.

Dr. Thompson: we have a mix of principals, ESE, parents community and mental health providers

Dr. David Maddock - Osceola: Sure

Dr. David Maddock - Osceola: There were a few closed ended Likert type questions as to opinion towards using distance learning

Carol Mela: Brevard has a task force with cabinet level members and the health department. They will reach out for input from the community and building level admin and teachers.

Dr. David Maddock - Osceola: And a few open ended questions about what could be improved and perceived barriers

Dr. David Maddock - Osceola: We're qualitatively coding the responses based on emergent themes

iris Williams: @ Holly yes what training and supports can Student services provide that maybe helpful with addressing the mental health needs of students ?

Christine K Crispino: Parent input is so valuable

Jayna Jenkins: Developing a "Recovery Plan" to support teachers and students/families ... ensure they feel safe in whatever environment we are entering. And part of this is a renewed focus, screener on SEL to understand which students need T2 SEL, which grade levels/schools may need Tier 1 revisited ... so that the academic learning can occur.

Holly Schultz: We are also becoming a Title I school in the fall, with some additional support and had already planned to look at our resources for interventions for next year to map that out and look for gaps to determine additional resources that we would want to access and use.

Cindy Leannah FDLRS/Springs: Are districts looking at/considering the CDC Considerations for returning schools?

Dr. Thompson: yes

Devon Minch: Thanks Beth! I'm not on the phone but I do know the FSCA is in the process of creating some guidance documents about family voice in reopening discussions and planning processes

Dr. Hall- Levy: Cindy, absolutely!

Krista Elder-FDLRS Sunrise: I've heard that one suggested implementation plan is to have all students in a classroom 6 feet apart with mask requirements. Will all counties have the capacity to do so and how will that work in an Pre K- elementary setting?

Devon Minch: When we have those ready, hopefully in the next few weeks, I'll be sure to share

Dr. Thompson: In Monroe we have the health department on the task force

Dr. David Maddock - Osceola: Yes. And if we have to continue with it, what changes need to be made to ensure that our teachers, parents, and students feel safe and supported

Jayna Jenkins: Cindy - we have to work with our local DoH and observe their recommendations .. and they base on CDC.

Holly Schultz: Lots of SEL lessons and support will be put into place at our school also.

Lisa Flannery: Any lessons people are willing to share with LisaRFL@Leeschools.net

Devon Minch: Of course, and yes we hope to have them ready by then as well

Dr. David Maddock - Osceola: We're seeing that many of our teachers are concerned about SEL with students, and desirous of structures and specific expectations

Teresa Jickell: WE should be muted if we on a computer. Correct?

Teresa Jickell: Sorry for the fat finger typing.

Blair - Pasco County: District is currently working on strengthening the work around our three critical teams, School-Based Leadership Teams, Teacher Teams, and School Intervention Teams. We are looking at needs, data, PD opportunities, and ways to pivot based on the distance learning needs.

Michelle Curtin- SJCS: Our teams have continued to hold specific student problem solving meetings during distance learning. Additionally, they are continuing with a review of school wide data trends. That should continue whether we are face to face or distance.

Holly Schultz: I believe at my school there will be flexibility in meeting format for our problem solving meetings, whether they will need to be held virtually or in person or a combination.

Blair - Pasco County: Yes

iris Williams: You may also contact Student Services at Bees for assistance with Mental health training and needs for your district as well.

Dr. David Maddock - Osceola: Our Superintendent announced today that all employees will return to normal hours and locations next Monday. Our problem solving meetings will likely happen in person, even if our students aren't in the building.

Ann Selland: Teresa if you are on your phone you would need to mute your speakers but if you are just using the computer you would not

Polk - Student Services: Osceola - will you be evaluating students in person for ESE initials and re-evals beginning next week as well?

Dr. David Maddock - Osceola: No decisions have been made in regard to that yet.

Polk - Student Services: Ok. Thanks for sharing.

Jodi Leung': My district also just shared they they want school psych's to start testing next week.

Patti Vickers: We're still in conversations about in person testing

Jonathan Chasin: Pasco will be starting face to face in the next two weeks.

Patti Vickers: No psychs in Osceola work over the summer so the soonest we'll be doing in person testing is August

Lara M - Baker: We have concerns about evaluating and making decisions about that data, after such a disruption to learning.

Patti Vickers: We do too, Lara

Jodi Leung': Agreed we do as well.

Polk County - Anastasia: Very legitimate concerns.

Lisa, Palm Beach: We are providing virtual PD through google meets. Various topics will be offered. Not sure yet about next year

Gulf--Martha Weimorts: FDLRS/PAEC has several online PD opportunities plan ned for our teachers and staff.

Dr. David Maddock - Osceola: All of our June PD will be digital. We haven't made a decision as to July PD yet and are waiting for a bit of guidance from the state about expectations for schools.

Lori Allen: more emphasis on SEL than before

Lara M - Baker: Social-emotional supports have been offered as PD - Suldo

Dr. Hall- Levy: Trauma Informed Care (More PD needed in this area)

Teresa Jickell: Seminole - All summer PD will be virtual.

Carrie Fuller: BEST Standards, Google, Orton Gillingham, Marzano, book studies...virtual PD. 17 different topics.

Lisa Flannery: Virtually- Resorative Practices- tier 1 behavior SEL

Dr. David Maddock - Osceola: We will still be providing content area academies and coaching academies. We also have multiple PDs on using technology for distance learning.

Polk - Student Services: All PD for the fall will be virtual

Blair - Pasco County: Multi-faceted. We are going to deliver virtual and are planning possible in-person professional development later in July. PD is lined up for teachers, admin, etc -Tier 1, Tier 2, building the bridge from distance learning, evaluating student work for rigor, the emphasis on SEL and universal screening of essential standards

Gulf--Martha Weimorts: MELD, Access curriculum in the gen. ed class, SEL, Inclusion

Katie Hamm: Pinellas - June PD is virtual, we are going face to face in July (at this point). Content is focused on what we typically provide - standards based, SEL, and ESE

Rosalina S: Yes, i would love more virtual PD oportunitites for SEL

Rosalina S: And TIC

Blair - Pasco County: Love Cat - she was my intern :)

Gulf--Martha Weimorts: It's a communication system for younger students

Teresa Jickell: Many of our PD session have a blended learning and virtual learning focus.

Rosalina S: Trauma Informed Care

Blair - Pasco County: 1. We have a virtual Tier 1 for all grades and subjects. 2. We are growing data systems to understand engagement and student performance, 3. We are evaluating the performance and strengths/weaknesses of our first district-wide efforts during these last few months (reflection).

Carrie Rullo: I think that transiiton to remote has prepared us well in moving forward, whether we are brick and mortar and then go bcaak out, we have outlined specific guidelines for problem solving as far as expectations on meetings, intervention delivery, etc,

Katie Hamm: That process is on-going. Collecting data from teachers, parents, and administrators for positives and barriers so that we can plan to overcome should the need arise again.

Dr. Thompson: were seeing the impact this has on teacher and steff. At first everyone was really excited, however, as VI went on they became weary, as did the parents

Gulf--Martha Weimorts: We are discussing a system where half our students attend face to face and half attend virtually at home so that social distancing practices can be used properly. We have concerns about how to use this model with elementary age students, because most parents will be working away from home and child care will become an issue for families.

Teresa Jickell: Our Curriculum Department has been producing lessons that may be used in a virtual environment. They are also reaching out to teachers to share leesons they used during distance learning that may be used in a F2F or virtual learning environment.

Katie Hamm: Yes, Dr. Thompson - the stamina for vidual instruction has been a struggle.

Teresa Jickell: We used iReady teacher assigned lessons for our intervention during DL.

Jayna Jenkins: I am looking at digging a little deeper into 'attendance' virtually ... if we have to go back to distance learning .. what data can we use to identify students who are engaged, and students who need support to be engaged ... we have to use more than the Chronic Absence indicator in distance learning ...

Gulf--Martha Weimorts: If COVID-19 makes a return in the fall, we will go back to online instruction. Our teachers have been training for the past 2 weeks to do this more effectively using Google classroom.

Gulf--Martha Weimorts: Yes, they will switch every other day.

iris Williams: @jayna I am working with attendance works and other stakeholders to provide some guidance with virtual attendance
